Thank you again for your letter requesting a study on whether and how a small claims patent tribunal could be established, and how such a tribunal might function. In your letter, you asked that the United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) engage the Administrative Conference of the United States (ACUS) to conduct that study. The USPTO and the ACUS have begun discussions on this undertaking, and I am hopeful that we will finalize an agreement and a statement of work by early 2022.
